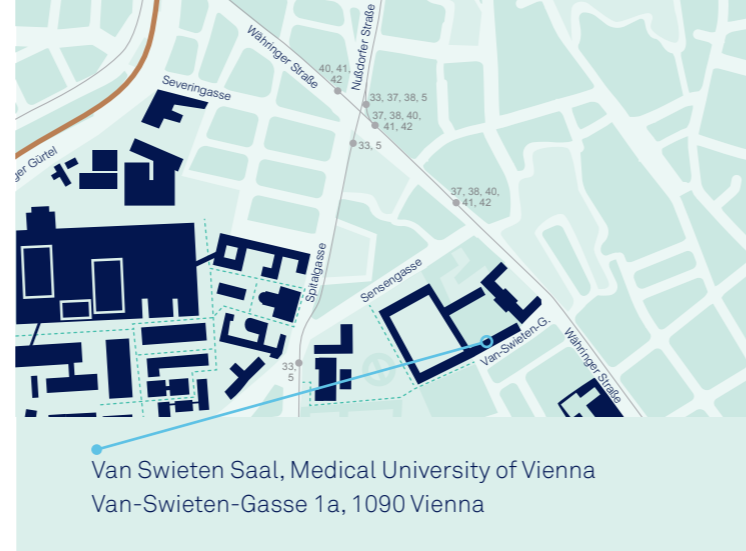

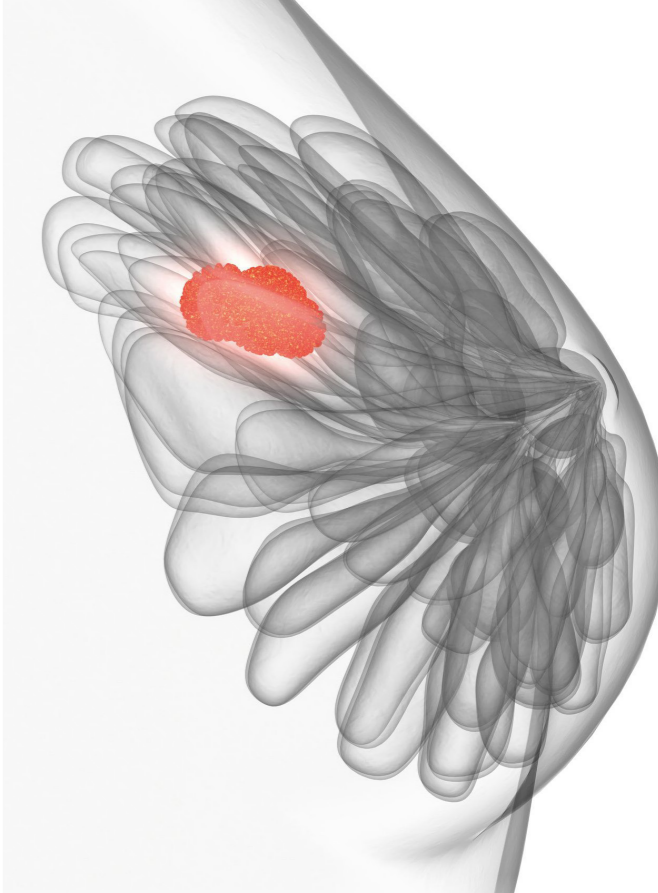

## Dear Colleagues,

The 3<sup>rd</sup> Vienna Breast Surgery Day focuses on two main topics: ductal carcinoma in-situ (DCIS) and the operation of stage-IV tumours. 30 percent of all breast operations are due to DCIS, and the mastectomy rates are even higher than those with invasive carcinoma.

The word “carcinoma” in DCIS gives many women an unnecessary shock. As DCIS does not cause metastases and can be cured, many experts would like to rename the disease. In addition to finding a less frightening term for DCIS, we should consider whether women are being over-treated and rethink our therapy approach.

Research data appear inconclusive about whether surgery is necessary for stage-IV tumours. We will discuss new prospective data coming from Canada, the US, and Europe, to help us determine future treatment.

We will discuss these topics with internationally-renowned experts and speakers, who are also speaking at the St. Gallen Breast Cancer Conference.

We look forward to welcoming you to the 3<sup>rd</sup> Vienna Breast Surgery Day.
